

SPONSOR CATEGORY

Since the number of candidates standing for the election in the Sponsor Member category is equal to the number of vacancies in that category (i.e. we have 2 candidates and 2 seats), no voting is required.

Rose JAMIESON and **Try THY** are therefore deemed elected as they are the only candidates in the Sponsor Member category.

CO-SPONSOR CATEGORY

Since the number of candidates standing for the election in the Co-Sponsor Member category was more the number of vacancies in that category (i.e. we have 2 candidates and 1 seat), voting is required.

Kevin MEYNELL is elected in the Co-Sponsor Member category through member votes.



Third-Party Scrutineer Report

Procedures and Findings

We have performed the procedures described below, which were agreed upon with DotAsia Organisation Limited, on monitoring the voting procedures and results.

1. We assessed the suggested third-party online voting platform by reviewing the third-party online voting platform on security and integrity

- Five trials had been taken from 13th to 15th of January 2026 on testing the procedures and results of the online voting platform (“BigPulse”). Random draw was failed on the first trial and extended testing was suggested. Results were satisfactory on the rest of the trials on the scenario of “random draw” and “majority vote win”.
- System testing has been performed for the followings:-
 - a. Timeline (including test vote open and close)
 - b. Roles of the Election Managers (Primary Poll Election Manager acting as “Election Chair”, Election Compliance Admin and Scrutineer)
 - c. Voting validation
 - d. Results validation

2. We obtained the results of the votes cast for the Board election, including in the poll results from BigPulse.

3. We arranged email confirmation from voters and compared the individual details of votes cast included in the summary to the email confirmation received.

Send reminder to voters yet to confirm after 24 hours.c. Acknowledgement of receipt will be sent to voters who have replied the confirmation email.d. Inform Election Committee if there is no reply after 48 hours and follow their recommendation.e. Any special request from voters will be sent to Election Committee for comments and final decision.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 6 out of 9 voters participated in this Board Election. No bounced email was found.• One voter did not confirm his/her vote in 48 hours. Such situation has been reported to the Election Committee (“EC”) immediately and no recommendation from the EC. According to the procedure, the vote was treated as invalid.• As a result, total 5 valid votes counted from those 6 voters.

RESULTS

Polling of Co-Sponsor Member of DotAsia Board Elections 2026 started from 19th January 2026 00:00 UTC and ended on 29th January 2026 23:59 UTC. There are total 9 potential voters. Each voter can select 1 candidate. 6 votes received from 6 voters and 5 votes were counted as valid. The voting details are listed below.

Voting for Geographical Diversity Requirement

2.8 Geographical Diversity Requirement of the BEP:

*“In the case where more than one candidate to satisfy the Geographical Diversity Requirement is nominated, and the candidates collectively are nominated from both the Sponsor and Co-Sponsor Member category seats, the calculation of the candidate to be returned to satisfy the Geographical Diversity Requirement will be determined by the **candidate receiving the highest percentage of votes** (calculated based on the total votes received against the total number of ballots issued for the corresponding category – as determined by the **List of Voters** in accordance with 2.1 Voter Qualification above).”*

$(\text{Geo Candidate Vote Count} / \text{Total Ballot Issued in Category}) \times 100 = \% \text{ of Vote of Geo Candidate}$



Voting for Geographical Diversity Requirement

$(\text{Geo Candidate Vote Count} / \text{Total Ballot Issued in Category}) \times 100 = \% \text{ of Vote of Geo Candidate}$

For Example

$7 / 21 \times 100 = 33.33\%$	$16 / 21 \times 100 = 76.19\%$	$7 / 9 \times 100 = 77.78\%$

Therefore, the winner of the Geo Candidate is C at 77.78%



2026 NomCom Roles & Responsibilities

- NomCom is tasked to:
 1. Establish and enforce an Election Code of Conduct;
 2. Vet and confirm eligible nominees in a DotAsia Board Election;
 3. Select for appointment one individual (every 3 years) to the DotAsia Board;
 4. Compiling a Nomination Report (based on 2);
 5. ***NEW to BEP*** Identify and confirm a candidate satisfying the Geographical Diversity Requirements for the composition of the DotAsia Board in the case that the candidates nominated by Members do not already meet such requirements.
- NomCom is delegated with the power to:
 - Complete the tasks independently (from the DotAsia Board)
 - Determine the non-compliance or ineligibility of a Board Election candidate (All Board candidates expressly waive any right to damages caused directly or indirectly by the decision of the NomCom)



2026 NomCom Roles & Responsibilities

5. Identify and confirm a candidate satisfying the Geographical Diversity Requirements for the composition of the DotAsia Board in the case that the candidates nominated by Members do not already meet such requirements.

Geographical Diversity Requirement

- The DotAsia Articles of Association requires in Part 2: 3(4) that, “Among the Directors, there shall be **at least one (1) Director from at least three (3) of the four (4) areas within the Pan-Asia and Asia Pacific region**, namely, North and Northeast Asia, South and Southeast Asia, Middle East, Asia Minor and Eurasia and, Australasia and Pacific.”
- Prior to Board Elections 2026, the Board Elections Procedures (<https://www.dot.asia/policies/BGC004-BoardElectionsProcedures-v2-1-20241211.pdf>) stipulates in Section 2.8 that, “In the case where upon the expiration of the term for the Directors at an AGM, no Director coming from two or more Sub-Regions remains, and no candidate is nominated from those two or more Sub-Regions by the close of the nomination period, **the Board** shall make a suggestion of an individual satisfying the Geographical Diversity Requirement to the Nomination Committee for their consideration to be nominated directly by the Nomination Committee, and/or otherwise make a suggestion to Sponsor or Co-Sponsor Members for their consideration. Thereupon, and before the close of the voting period, an eligible Member of the corresponding member category should propose and another eligible Member from the same corresponding member category should second the nomination for a candidate who must also accept such nomination to allow for the candidate to be officially accepted.
- In light of the very similar nature of tasks 2 & 3 of the NomCom above, in the BEP 2026, the DotAsia Board is delegating the exception process to the NomCom. Instead of having “ the Board shall make a suggestion of an individual satisfying the Geographical Diversity Requirement to the Nomination Committee for their consideration”, **BEP 2026 stipulates that “the NomCom shall identify an individual satisfying the Geographical Diversity Requirement to be nominated”**.

 - Abidance by the DotAsia Code of Conduct & Board Confidentiality Guidelines
 - Demonstrate participation in and familiarity with DotAsia works
- NomCom determination on eligibility:
 - DotAsia Team report on validity of declarations (on best efforts basis)
- Publishing of Nominations Report
 - DotAsia AA 23(2): A Nominations Report including all confirmed eligible nominees shall have been sent to the Board after the nomination period and before the voting period



Nomination Period Results (Nominations Report)

- NomCom reviewed four members-nominated candidates and confirmed all four candidates as eligible, three of them were elected
 - Sponsor Member (2 candidates for 2 vacancies) – No voting required
 - Co-Sponsor Member (2 candidate for 1 vacancy) - Voting required



- **AI as the Primary Catalyst for a "Cyber Arms Race"**
- **The Rise of Cyber-Enabled Fraud and Indistinguishable Deepfakes**
 - Cyber-enabled fraud is now the top concern for CEOs, overtaking traditional ransomware.
 - AI-generated deepfakes are expected to be nearly impossible to spot.
 - Scammers are using deepfakes to clone executive voices or create convincing videos to authorize fraudulent payments.





Expanding Revenue Base

- In 2025, DotAsia expanded its market reach in Central Asia, including new partnerships in Kazakhstan (.KZ) and Uzbekistan (.UZ).
 - With strong uptake in China driven by a mixture of special seasonal and price promotions [RY.2], the total number of DotAsia (.Asia) Domains Under Management (DUM) surged to over 400,000 at the end of the calendar year 2025 [RY.1].



Starting in 2019 through 2020, the DotAsia team working with the Board Community Project Committee (BCC) reviewed the core community projects and contributions, and studied different Social Impact Assessment (SIA) methodologies, including particularly the [Actionable Impact Management \(AIM\)](#) approach developed in collaboration with the University of Melbourne's Asia Pacific Social Impact Centre, Social Return on Investment (SROI) approaches, and the [Hong Kong Council of Social Services \(HKCSS\) SIA Framework](#).




