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DotAsia Organisation Policies & Processes

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Executive Summary

This document sets out the rules and procedures for the DotAsia Organisation Board Elections in 2010. The general specifications have been laid out in the Memorandum and Articles of Incorporation. This document provides clarifications, interpretations and additional details for the implementation of the 2010 Board Elections for DotAsia.

Each eligible Member may nominate, second and vote for an individual as a candidate in the Board Elections. Each eligible Member may make a total number of nominations, seconds and votes which is equal to the number of vacancies to the Board for the relevant category (Sponsor Member and Co-sponsor Member).

The vacancies in the Board Elections 2010 for each Member category are:

- Sponsor Member: 4
- Co-Sponsor Member: 1

The candidate receiving the greatest number of votes in his/her favour within his/her category will be declared to be elected to the Board for such category. In this Board Elections, all elected Directors representing each category shall serve on the board for 2 years.

The timeline for the elections is as follows:

- December 9, 2009 (Wed) – Nomination Period Begins (5 weeks)
- January 13, 2010 (Wed) – Nomination Period Ends
- January 27, 2010 (Wed) – Voting Period Begins (2 weeks)
- February 10, 2010 (Wed) – Voting Period Ends
- February 28, 2010 (Sun) – Annual General Meeting
- February 28, 2010 (Sun) – New elected Board members assume office

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Policy

1 Memorandum and Articles of Association

The Board Elections are consistent and comply with the clauses as set out in the Memorandum and Articles of Association (“M&A”) of DotAsia Organisation Limited (“DotAsia”).

1.1 Timeframe of Board Elections

According to the M&A, Article 34:

“The four (4) elected initial Directors representing the Sponsor Members who received most votes shall serve on the Board for two (2) years or until the next annual general meeting after the two (2) years served. The remaining four (4) elected initial Directors representing the Sponsor Members shall serve on the Board for one (1) year or until the next annual general meeting after the one (1) year served. The elected initial Director representing the Co-Sponsor Members who received most votes shall serve on the Board for two (2) years or until the next annual general meeting after the two (2) years served, while the remaining elected initial Director representing the Co-Sponsor Members shall serve on the Board for one (1) year or until the next annual general meeting after the one (1) year served.”

Based on this clause, 4 elected Initial Directors representing the Sponsor Members and 1 elected initial Director representing the Co-Sponsor Members who were elected with 1-year term, shall retire on or before the upcoming Annual General Meeting (“AGM”) which is scheduled to be held on February 28, 2010. 1.2 Term of Elected Directors

According to the M&A, Article 37, the terms for the elected Directors will be determined as follows:

“...all Directors serve on the Board for two (2) years and expire upon the conclusion of an annual general meeting. If such annual general meeting concludes within ninety (90) days of, before or

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after, the completion of two (2) years served by the Director, the term of the Director shall expire upon the conclusion of such annual general meeting. Otherwise, the Director shall serve until the next annual general meeting after the two (2) years served"

1.3 Nomination of Candidates

According to Article 40 (a) of the M&A:

"Each candidate standing for election to the Board for each category of Members must be a natural person proposed by an existing Member of the Company and seconded by another existing Member of the Company. Both proposer and the seconder must be from the same category of Members as the category for which the candidate is standing for election."

Furthermore, Article 40 (c) of the M&A specifies that:

"A candidate for election to the Board cannot stand for more than one category of Members at the same election."

1.4 Voting by Members

As described in Article 40 (d) of the M&A, if on the close of the nomination period, the number of candidates standing for election is equal to or less than the number of vacancies for such category, no voting would be required. Where voting is necessary, the requirements are specified in the M&A, Article 40 (e)-(g) as follows:

"(e) If the number of candidates standing for election to the Board for a category is greater than the number of vacancies in the Board for such category, the election to the Board shall be made by way of a ballot.

(f) Each Member of a category is entitled to a number of votes which is equal to the number of vacancies to the Board for the relevant category. No Member so voting may cast more than one (1) vote in favour of each candidate.

(g) The candidate receiving the greatest number of votes in his favour within his category will be declared to be elected to the Board for such category. In case of an equality of votes, the election shall be decided by way of lot."

2 Rules and Procedures

In addition to the specifications already laid out in the M&A, this section will provide some clarifications to the Nomination and Voting rules and procedures. More specifically on the eligibility of Nomination, Voting and participation in the ratification process through the Annual General Meeting. Furthermore, a set of rules for satisfying the Geographical Diversity Requirement as described in Article 33 of the M&A will be described.

2.1 Nomination

In order to be eligible to propose or to second a nomination for a candidate, a Member must be listed on the DotAsia website, at: <http://dot.asia/about/members.html> on or before the opening of the Nomination Period, as specified in Section 3 below.

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In addition to the specifications as set out in the M&A and described in section 1.4 above, Each Member of a category is entitled to make a total number of nomination proposals equal to the number of vacancies to the Board for the corresponding category. Similarly, each Member of a category is entitled to make a total number of seconds, which is equal to the number of vacancies to the Board for the corresponding category.

The vacancies in this Board Election for each Member category are:

- Sponsor Member: 4
- Co-Sponsor Member: 1

Before the Nomination Period, the company secretary shall confirm the email address from which a Member would be using to make nominations, seconds, and to cast votes. Nominations, including the proposer and the seconder shall be submitted via email by the Member to the company secretary: secretary@dotasia.org. All submissions will be confirmed by the company secretary by email back to the submitter and thereupon a confirmation reply email from the submitter must be received by the Secretary to complete the confirmation.

A template for the nomination proposer and seconder and is included in Appendix A.

Once a nomination and a second is received for a specific candidate, the company secretary will email the candidate for his/her confirmation of acceptance of candidacy.

During the Nomination Period, the company secretary will from time to time provide to Members an update on nominations and seconds received. The company secretary will only display to Members one Nominator and one Seconder even if multiple nominations and/or seconds are received. If more than one nomination is received for a specific candidate, the first nominator will be considered the Nominator and the second nominator will be considered a Seconder. If more than one seconds are received for a specific candidate, the first seconder will be considered the Seconder and subsequent seconds received will not be displayed.

In the case where a fraudulent or defective nomination is received and confirmed, the company secretary shall notify the Board and the disqualification of such nomination shall be determined by resolution of the Board.

The nomination proposer, seconder as well as the acceptance of the candidate will be received and confirmed and submitted to the Board not less than fourteen (14) but not more than twenty-eight (28) days before the opening of the Voting Period.

2.2 Voting

In the case where voting is necessary, in order to be eligible to cast a ballot for the Board Elections, a Member must be listed on the DotAsia website, at: <http://www.dotasia.org/about/members.html> on or before the opening of the Voting Period, as specified in Section 3 below.

At the opening of the Voting Period, the company secretary shall send, via email, ballots to each eligible Member. Ballots shall be casted via email by the Member to the company secretary at an email address to be provided in the ballot, within the Voting Period. All ballots will be confirmed by the company secretary by email back to the Member and thereupon a confirmation reply email from the Member must be received by the company secretary to complete the confirmation.

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A template of the voting ballot is included in Appendix B.

In the case where a fraudulent or defective ballot is received and confirmed, the company secretary shall notify the Board and the disqualification of such ballot shall be determined by resolution of the Board.

2.3 Quorum and Ratification of Election Results

According to Article 18 of the M&A:

“The quorum for a general meeting shall be ten (10) or 50 percent of the total number of Members (whichever is less) and the quorum must continue to be present throughout the meeting. A member may attend a meeting in person or via available electronic means including telephone conference or video conference.”

In the case where voting is necessary, results of the Board Elections will be ratified at the upcoming AGM.

For the purposes of quorum for a General Meeting, Members listed on the DotAsia website, at: <http://dot.asia/about/members.html> shall be considered.

2.4 Geographical Diversity Requirement

In addition to the maximum number of Directors to be returned from each category, a geographical diversity requirement is specified in Article 33. of the M&A:

“Among the eight (8) Directors elected by the Sponsor Members, there shall be at least one (1) Director from each of the four (4) areas within the Pan-Asia and Asia Pacific region, namely, North and Northeast Asia, South and Southeast Asia, Middle East, Asia Minor and Eurasia and, Australia and Pacific.”

A more detailed description of the 4 areas (“Sub-Regions”) and the corresponding economies and countries included is provided in Appendix C.

As explained in Section 1.1 above, the remaining Board of Directors from the Sponsor Members category (from the Board Elections 2008) include:

Upon the expiration of the term for the Directors as explained in Section 1.1 above, there will be no remaining Director coming from the following 2 Sub-Regions:

- Middle East, Asia Minor and Eurasia
- Australia and Pacific

In accordance with the geographical diversity requirement specified in Article 33. of the M&A therefore, there shall be at least 1 Director elected for each of the 2 Sub-Regions: Middle East, Asia Minor and Eurasia; and, Australia and Pacific.

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In the case where only one candidate is nominated from one (or each) of these Sub-Regions by the close of the nomination period, by interpretation of Article 40(d), the nominated candidate shall be deemed to be elected.

In the case where no candidate is nominated from one (or both) of these Sub-Regions by the close of the nomination period, the Board shall make a suggestion of an individual satisfying the Geographical Diversity Requirement to Sponsor Members for their consideration. Thereupon, and before the close of the voting period, an eligible Sponsor Member should propose and another eligible Sponsor Member should second the nomination for a candidate who must also accept such nomination to allow for the candidate to be officially accepted.

2.5 By-Election in case of Vacancies

According to Article 40(d) of the M&A:

“If there is any vacancy in the Board for any categories of Members, such vacancy shall be filled by a by-election by the Members of such category within one month of the occurrence of such vacancy in accordance with procedures set out in this Article 40.”

In the case where the total number of elected board members is less than the vacancies in a particular category, the Board shall make suggestions of individuals to be considered by the Members in the particular category. Thereupon an eligible Member should propose and another eligible Member should second the nomination for a candidate who must also accept such nomination to allow for the candidates to be officially accepted. Members in the particular category may also nominate additional candidates in the by-election nomination period.

The nomination and voting procedures will follow those set out in Sections 1.3, 1.4, 2.1 and 2.2, with the time frame set out in Section 3 below.

3 Board Election Schedule

The following is the time schedule for this Board Election in 2010:

- December 9, 2009 (Wed) – Nomination Period Begins (5 weeks)
- January 13, 2010 (Wed) – Nomination Period Ends
- January 27, 2010 (Wed) – Voting Period Begins (if necessary, 2 weeks)
- February 10, 2010 (Wed) – Voting Period Ends
- February 28, 2010 (Sun) – Annual General Meeting (results ratification)
- February 28, 2010 (Sun) – New elected Board members assumes office

In the case a by-election is required, the following time schedule should be used:

- Day 0 – Identification and determination of a vacancy by the Board
- Day 1 – Extraordinary General Meeting called for Day 30
- Day 3 – Nomination Period Begins (5 days)
- Day 8 – Nomination Period Ends
- Day 22 – Voting Period Begins (if necessary, 5 days)
- Day 27 – Voting Period Ends
- Day 30 – Extraordinary General Meeting (if necessary)
